Discover the fascinating landscapes and cultures on this 13- or 20-night itinerary that will take you through the backroads and off-the-beaten track to uncover the scenic treasures of Canada's west coast and western interior. From the urban splendour of Vancouver, the trail leads to the picturesque tranquility of British Columbia's and Alberta's national parks. You will experience firsthand the brilliant turquoise lakes and the rugged beauty of the Rocky Mountains. Returning to the Pacific Coast via Whistler your adventure either comes to an end with a return to Vancouver, or you continue on to visit Victoria with its maritime heritage and colonial demeanour. A wealth of activities are available throughout your trip from the thrill of rafting and canoeing to hiking and horseback riding.

ITINERARY

DAY 1 ARRIVAL IN VANCOUVER

Arrive Vancouver International Airport, transfer independently to your downtown hotel. The Roadbook you received will have all the information needed for your holiday/trip/journey. The rest of the day is yours to create your own urban adventure amid the stores, parks, restaurants, theatres and other attractions of downtown Vancouver.

Accommodation: Vancouver for 1 night

DAY 2 VANCOUVER - KAMLOOPS (357 KM)

Leaving Vancouver behind you will drive out to the vast ranch lands of British Columbia's interior. You will follow the Gold Rush Trail, alongside the mighty Fraser River. At Hell's Gate or Boston Bar you may decide to briefly explore the imposing Fraser Canyon by airtram, or visit Lytton, one of the villages made famous by the Gold Rush. Passing through Merritt, you continue on to Kamloops - one of the main hubs of central British Columbia.

Accommodation: Kamloops for 1 night

DAY 3 KAMLOOPS - WELLS GRAY PROVINCIAL PARK (124 KM)

Your journey to the breathtaking vistas of Wells Gray Provincial Park leads you along the scenic Yellowhead Highway through the water and lava-shaped valley of the North Thompson River. You won't want to miss a visit to Clearwater's Yellowhead Museum for a taste of frontier life, or a stop at Spahats Creek Park where the volcanic origins of the area are still in evidence.

Accommodation: Wells Gray Provincial Park for 2 nights

DAY 4 WELLS GRAY PROVINCIAL PARK

Enjoy your day at Wells Gray Ranch, a ranch that offers hiking, fishing and river rafting experiences.

DAY 5 WELLS GRAY PROVINCIAL PARK - JASPER (318 KM)

Today, you will leave the peaceful delights of Wells Gray to head for the unforgettable splendor of the Rocky Mountains. En route to Jasper you will drive by the panoramic views of Mount Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies.

Accommodation: Jasper for 1 night

DAY 6 JASPER - BANFF (288 KM)

Start your day with a ride on the Jasper Skytram, giving you a bird's eye view of the town and the surrounding parklands. Afterwards, depart along the Icefields Parkway, meandering through a landscape of peaks and glaciers, before pausing to admire the picturesque alpine waters of Peyto Lake and Moraine Lake. The sparkling, turquoise colours and the impressive glacier of Lake Louise are next on your not-to-be-missed list. The Trans-Canada Highway leads you to Banff, a year-round resort region that will treat you to spectacular wilderness scenery, outdoor sporting activities and modern accommodation facilities.

Accommodation: Banff for 2 nights

DAY 7 BANFF NATIONAL PARK (155 KM)

Banff is yours to discover today. You can visit the Cave and Basin and Bow Falls, and take a thrilling gondola ride to the summit of Sulphur Mountain. Other activities offered in the park for your pleasure include river rafting, biking, horseback riding and hiking.

DAY 8 BANFF – INVERMERE / RADIUM HOT SPRINGS (152 KM)

Today you will drive through Kootenay National Park, a landscape dominated by lofty peaks, glaciers, deep valleys and crystal-blue lakes. A visit to the park's hot springs or the Radium Hot Springs Resort which offers numerous activities and sights. Wildflowers decorate the alpine meadows, while grizzly bears, moose and mountain goats roam the park.

Accommodation: Invermere / Radium Hot Springs for 2 nights

DAY 9 INVERMERE / RADIUM HOT SPRINGS

Spend a full day in Invermere, a summer paradise for outdoor enthusiasts. Enjoy a myriad of activities, such as hiking, fishing, bird watching, boating and windsurfing on Lake Windermere. You can also visit Invermere's museum housing pioneer artifacts and local archives.

DAY 10 INVERMERE / RADIUM HOT SPRINGS - NELSON (373 KM)

From fresh water to fresh air, today, you will advance through the Kootenays. Respected by backpackers as a wilderness oasis of towering mountains, fresh air and abundant wildlife, this remote area is a traveller's dream... no crowds and no pollution. The area has been shaped by gold-seekers, a heritage celebrated in historic Fort Steele. You will enjoy the vistas of the Purcell and Selkirk mountain ranges as you take the world's longest free ferry ride across Kootenay Lake to Balfour. Your afternoon is free to explore Nelson, the reputed heritage capital of Western Canada.

Accommodation: Nelson for 1 night

DAY 11 NELSON – OLIVER / OSOYOOS / PENTICTON (261 KM)

The scenic adventure continues outbound from Nelson, parallel to the American border, across Bonanza Pass and Gold Canyon. Boasting towering mountains, gentle valleys and sparkling lakes, this area is a haven for hikers and canoeists. Visit Grand Forks on the Kettle River reliving the period of Russian settlement or enjoying some excellent fishing.

Accommodation: Oliver / Osoyoos / Penticton for 2 nights

DAY 12 OLIVER / OSOYOOS / PENTICTON

Take the day and explore the local area. Penticton boasts over 15 wide, sandy public beaches to relax and lounge on. If a day at the waterfront is not to your liking, perhaps a tasting tour at one of the 80 local wineries will provide a day of delectable indulgence!

DAY 13 OLIVER / OSOYOOS / PENTICTON - ABBOTSFORD (247 KM)

En route to the sub-alpine meadows in Manning Provincial Park, you will drop into Oliver Park, the only true desert in Canada. Alternately, you will enjoy a hike through pristine Cathedral Provincial Park. Afterwards, you can explore Manning Provincial Park, known for its meadows and diverse vegetation. The day's highlight comes after an extensive hike along the trail network — a picture-perfect view of Three Brothers Mountain and Thunder Lake.

Accommodation: Abbotsford for 1 night

DAY 14 ABBOTSFORD - WHISTLER (300 KM)

Today the road leads northward along a route less travelled, boasting some of the most stunning scenery of the province interrupted only by small communities that thrive on the forestry and eco-tourism industries. Perhaps stop for a short time in the mountain village of Lilloet for a taste of small town western life. Turning westward, continue on to Whistler where one of the great destinations of the Canadian west awaits!

Accommodation: Whistler for 1 night

**End of the 14-day program – Abbotsford to Vancouver*

DAY 15 WHISTLER - POWELL RIVER (222 KM)

You will drive past the sweeping seascapes, rugged cliffs, broad beaches and serene inlets of the breathtaking Sunshine Coast this morning before boarding for the first of several BC Ferries rides. Powell River is set against the backdrop of the Coast Mountains and offers great opportunities for outdoor activities including sea-kayaking, sailing, hiking and mountain biking. The coastal waters boast a rich variety of marine wildlife.

Accommodation: Powell River for 1 night

DAY 16 POWELL RIVER - CAMPBELL RIVER (70 KM, land only)

This morning starts with a refreshing BC Ferries cruise across the Strait of Georgia to Vancouver Island. Look closely and you may even encounter some orcas. From the ferry, you will drive north through Comox Valley and up to Campbell River, a salmon-fishing paradise. Campbell River is recognized as a hub for outdoor adventure, close to Strathcona Provincial Park and home to such attractions as the Discovery Fishing Pier and the Discovery Passage Aquarium.

Accommodation: Campbell River for 1 night

DAY 17 CAMPBELL RIVER - PACIFIC RIM NATIONAL PARK (256 KM, land only)

Today a panorama of scenic beauty is about to unfold before you. You will cross Vancouver Island to the Pacific Coast through ancient rainforests and provincial parks. You're venturing into true wildlife territory here, and you might even glimpse bears, deer, wolves and cougars. Even if you don't see them, you can be sure they're watching you. The Pacific Rim National Park is a marvel of ecological and geographical diversity, as you will see as you pass through dense rainforests, steep ravines and windswept beaches.

Accommodation: Pacific Rim National Park for 2 nights

DAY 18 PACIFIC RIM NATIONAL PARK

You're free to explore the rugged coastline along the network of hiking trails or walk the shoreline of Long Beach in search of shells and driftwood.

DAY 19 PACIFIC RIM NATIONAL PARK - VICTORIA (194 KM)

This morning the spectacular winding road takes you back to the east coast of the island with visits to Horne Lake Caves or Cathedral Grove. Your itinerary will reveal many hidden gems including native rock carvings at Sproat Lake and the picturesque falls at Little Qualicum Falls Provincial Park. Passing through Nanaimo, you continue along the scenic Malahat Drive where you may decide to visit the murals of Chemainus or, the Forest Museum. Alternately, you may wish to visit the Quw'utsun' Cultural and Conference Centre in Duncan, scenically situated on six acres of landscaped pasture land. Representatives of the museum recall the Great Deeds – an oral history and legends of the Quw'utsun' people. The day's journey ends in Victoria, where the city's beautiful gardens and architecture celebrate its maritime heritage and colonial charm.

Accommodation: Victoria for 1 night

DAY 20 VICTORIA - VANCOUVER (70 KM, land only)

A final day on the island reveals the serene beauty of the Saanich Peninsula with its quiet beaches, meandering lanes and colonial-style architecture. Visit Butchart Gardens, located in a former stone quarry and renowned for its horticultural diversity, before enjoying a mini-cruise onboard BC Ferries back to Vancouver.

Accommodation: Vancouver Airport for 1 night

DAY 21 VANCOUVER - END OF TOUR

Return to Vancouver International Airport in time to check-in for your return flight.

Moving higher into the Rocky Mountains, you will relish the clean air, sparkling water and breathtaking scenery of Whistler, Jasper and Banff. You will be thrilled by energetic mountain safaris through Kootenay National Park and the fertile Okanagan Valley.

ITINERARY

DAY 1 ARRIVAL IN VANCOUVER

Your adventure begins at Vancouver International Airport. Transfer independently to your downtown hotel. The Roadbook you received will have all the information needed for your holiday/trip/journey. Take the rest of the day to create your own urban adventure amid the stores, parks, restaurants, theatres and other attractions in downtown Vancouver.

Accommodation: Vancouver for 2 nights

DAY 2 VANCOUVER

You have the entire day at leisure to explore Vancouver and surroundings. You may want to visit Stanley Park, the MacMillan Planetarium, Chinatown, Gastown, the Capilano Suspension Bridge, Granville Island and Grouse Mountain. Overnight in Vancouver.

DAY 3 VANCOUVER - VICTORIA (70 KM)

The BC Ferries cruise across the Strait of Georgia will transport you to Vancouver Island, passing the rugged coastline and tranquil beaches of the Gulf Islands. Make your way to Victoria, the capital of British Columbia, with its maritime heritage and colonial charm. You may end your day with a visit to the Empress Hotel for traditional High Tea.

Accommodation: Victoria for 1 night

DAY 4 VICTORIA - PARKSVILLE (149 KM)

Back on the road, you'll savour scenic ocean vistas as you explore the coast via gently winding Malahat Drive. The coastline is strewn with charming villages and offers breathtaking vistas and nature reserves with abundant wildlife. En route, you may detour to visit the murals of Chemainus, the Forest Museum, Cowichan Bay area and the quaint Quw'utsun' Cultural and Conference Centre in Duncan.

Accommodation: Parksville for 2 nights

DAY 5 PARKSVILLE

A glorious beach, three nearby provincial parks and excellent fishing opportunities have made Parksville a popular resort. You will enjoy angling for trout or salmon against the backdrop of fir forests, waterfalls and lush rainforests. The Parksville area resort tempts active visitors with tennis, volleyball, mountain biking, horseback riding, kayaking and hiking trails.

DAY 6 PARKSVILLE - WHISTLER (139 KM)

The day begins with a scenic BC Ferries ride back through the Strait of Georgia to the mainland. From there, you'll follow the spectacular Seato- Sky Highway to Whistler Resort, located at the foot of Whistler and Blackcomb Mountain. En route, you will admire Shannon Falls and explore the dramatic canyons, ravines and lofty peaks of Garibaldi Provincial Park.

Accommodation: Whistler for 2 nights

DAY 7 WHISTLER

Trade the freedom of the road for the adventure of the wilderness. Play a championship golf course in the shadow of towering mountain ranges, hike along endless trails and high alpine meadows, and ride on horseback past spectacular glaciers or whitewater raft down one of the turbulent rivers. You may wish to just relax in the enchanting setting of the pedestrian village and enjoy the boutiques, restaurants and cafés.

DAY 8 WHISTLER - 100 MILE HOUSE (306 KM)

'Smile, you're in 100 Mile!' is the catchphrase welcoming visitors to this 1862 Gold Rush 'truck stop'. Located exactly 100 miles from Lillooet on the "Old Cariboo Gold Rush Trail", this small community has been welcoming travellers since the early pioneer days. A gateway to over 100 recreational and fishing lakes, the 100 Mile region is home to some of the best lake trout and kokanee salmon in North America.

Accommodation: 100 Mile House for 1 night

DAY 9 100 MILE HOUSE - QUESNEL (205 KM)

Following in the footsteps of pioneering adventure seekers, you'll travel further down the "Old Cariboo Gold Rush Trail" today. Passing through soaring mountain canyons, you'll encounter innumerable logging villages and gold ghost towns on your way to the wilderness town of Quesnel. En route, don't miss a visit to Barkerville, a restored 19th-century settlement.

Accommodation: Quesnel for 1 night

DAY 10 QUESNEL – MCBRIDE / VALEMOUNT (319 KM)

Continuing your journey through history, you'll visit the turn-of-the-century railway boom town of McBride. Situated on the fertile land around the Fraser River, this bustling market town offers visitors a rare glimpse of a true Canadian rustic lifestyle. If you have time, drive just 1.5 km outside McBride to Koeneman Regional Park. Named after an early homesteading family, this Park is home to Rainbow Falls and Dear Mountain which offer spectacular views of Robson Valley and the Cariboo Mountains.

Accommodation: McBride for 1 night

DAY 11 MCBRIDE / VALEMOUNT - LAKE LOUISE (395 KM)

Today you'll traverse the Rocky Mountains along the spectacular Icefields Parkway. Flanked by snow-covered mountain ridges, cascading waterfalls and sparkling glaciers you'll see the spectacular Athabasca Glacier, where you can take an Ice Explorer ride.

Accommodation: Lake Louise for 1 night

DAY 12 LAKE LOUISE - BANFF (58 KM)

The Trans-Canada Highway leads you to Banff, a year-round resort region that boasts true wilderness scenery, numerous outdoor activities and modern accommodation facilities. An internationally renowned national park, Banff offers a world of sightseeing opportunities. Prepare for a full day of spectacular scenery tomorrow.

Accommodation: Banff for 2 nights

DAY 13 BANFF NATIONAL PARK

The day is at leisure to explore Banff and its environs. You may want to go on a discovery tour of the famous resort town, visit the Cave and Basin and Bow Falls, and take a thrilling gondola ride to the summit of Sulphur Mountain.

DAY 14 BANFF - INVERMERE / RADIUM HOT SPRINGS (171 KM)

Today you will drive through Kootenay National Park, a landscape dominated by lofty peaks, glaciers, deep valleys and crystal-blue lakes. A visit to the park's hot springs or the Radium Hot Springs Resort offers numerous activities and sights. Wildflowers decorate the alpine meadows, while grizzly bears, moose and mountain goats roam the park.

Accommodation: Invermere /Radium Hot Springs for 2 nights

DAY 15 INVERMERE / RADIUM HOT SPRINGS

Spend a full day in Invermere, a summer paradise for outdoor enthusiasts. Enjoy a myriad of activities, such as hiking, fishing, bird watching, boating and windsurfing on Lake Windermere. You can also visit Invermere's museum housing pioneer artifacts and local archives. The local hot springs offer a relaxing mineral bath, soothing the body and spirit alike.

DAY 16 INVERMERE / RADIUM HOT SPRINGS - ROSSLAND/CASTLEGAR (390 KM)

Driving high above the valley today you'll arrive at Rossland, one of Canada's more unusual townships. Nestled within the crater of a long extinct volcano, Rossland was the largest town in British Columbia at the height of the Gold Rush. Today, this charming alpine village is home to two Canadian Olympic Champion skiers, world-class mountain-biking facilities, two museums, scenic lakes and hiking trails that conveniently begin in the heart of the town.

Accommodation: Rossland / Castlegar for 1 night

DAY 17 ROSSLAND / CASTLEGAR - PENTICTON (283 KM)

A leisurely drive down the mountain today will carry you to Penticton, situated between the Skaha and Okanagan lakes. A native word meaning 'place to live forever', Penticton today is the thriving fruit capital of British Columbia. Every spring, the city blooms as thousands of fruit trees cast an unforgettable fragrance and wash of colour across the city limits.

Accommodation: Penticton for 2 nights

DAY 18 PENTICTON

You'll have more time today to further explore this fertile farm region. Don't miss the Okanagan River Channel - a man-made canal running between the Skaha and Okanagan lakes and a marvel of modern engineering. Another local highlight is the beached SS Sicamous, a 72 m lake sternwheeler that travels the waterways as it would have done over a century ago.

DAY 19 PENTICTON - VANCOUVER (418 KM)

Today you traverse the very heart of British Columbia. At the half way point, you may enjoy a brief stop in Hope - its ruggedly spectacular scenery often attracting film crews from Hollywood and around the world. For outdoor enthusiasts, Manning Provincial Park is a favourite destination because of its deep valleys, Blackwall Peak alpine meadows, Cascade Lookout and azure-blue lakes. Continue through and down the mountains to arrive at the coastline and the welcome, modern metropolis of Vancouver.

Accommodation: Vancouver for 1 night

DAY 20 VANCOUVER - END OF TOUR

Return to Vancouver International Airport in time for check-in for your return flight.

GREAT PARKS OF THE WEST

14 DAYS / 13 NIGHTS



Beautiful Vancouver is the starting point for this two-week circular tour that showcases the national parks of the Canadian Rockies. Eastbound from Vancouver, the itinerary ventures through the Okanagan Valley, Glacier National Park, and Banff and Jasper national parks. Drive west from Jasper through the Yellowhead Pass, Wells Gray Provincial Park and Garibaldi Provincial Park before returning to Vancouver.

ITINERARY

DAY 1 ARRIVAL IN VANCOUVER

Arrive Vancouver International Airport and transfer independently to your downtown hotel. The Roadbook you received will have all the information needed for your holiday/trip/journey. Remainder of the day is at leisure.

Accommodation: Vancouver for 2 nights

DAY 2 VANCOUVER

Full day in Vancouver and the surrounding area. Climb aboard a San Francisco-style trolley for a fully-commented Vancouver city tour. Sightsee at your own pace as you hop-on and hop-off for any length of time at many premier attractions, parks, gardens, galleries and restaurants.

DAY 3 VANCOUVER - PENTICTON (417 KM)

Travel through the Coastal Mountains and Manning Provincial Park. In the park, you can take a walk on the remnants of the Dewdney Trail or the Rhododendron Flats. The town of Penticton lies at the lower end of Okanagan Lake and the lush orchards and vineyards of the Okanagan Valley. The region is also renowned for its beaches and hot, dry climate.

Accommodation: Penticton for 1 night

DAY 4 PENTICTON - REVELSTOKE (260 KM)

Morning is at leisure to enjoy the Okanagan Valley. Then drive past spectacular waterfalls, towering peaks and beautiful lakes en route to the Revelstoke area.

Accommodation: Revelstoke for 1 night

DAY 5 REVELSTOKE - BANFF (283 KM)

Scenic drive through Glacier National Park and Rogers Pass en route to Canada's oldest national park and the bustling resort town of Banff.

Accommodation: Banff for 2 nights

DAY 6 BANFF NATIONAL PARK

Entire day to tour Banff and the surrounding area. We suggest a visit to the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel or Bow Falls or ride the Sulphur Mountain Gondola. You may also try river rafting or a boat tour on Lake Minnewanka.

DAY 7 BANFF - JASPER (288 KM)

Drive to Jasper via the spectacular Icefields Parkway. We suggest a stop at Peyto Lake and an Ice Explorer ride on the Columbia Icefield.

Accommodation: Jasper for 2 nights

DAY 8 - JASPER NATIONAL PARK

You have a full day to relax and tour Jasper and the surrounding area. We suggest a ride on the Jasper SkyTram or a visit to Miette Hot Springs. If time permits, the Athabasca River can offer exciting whitewater rafting excursions.

DAY 9 JASPER - 100 MILE HOUSE (451 KM)

Drive through the Yellowhead Pass, beside Mount Robson, the highest peak in the Rockies, and continue south along the Thompson River, skirting the perimeter of Wells Gray Provincial Park. We suggest stops in Blue River and Clearwater en route to 100 Mile House.

Accommodation: 100 Mile House for 2 nights

DAY 10 100 MILE HOUSE

100 Mile House was founded during the days of the Cariboo Gold Rush, when a roadhouse was built here to service gold seekers heading to the goldfields. They travelled along the Cariboo Wagon Road, beginning in Lillooet and frequently stopped at the roadhouse that became known as 100 Mile House. The area is now known primarily for prime cattle ranching and leisure activities.

DAY 11 100 MILE HOUSE - WHISTLER (300 KM)

Scenic drive south along the Cariboo Highway and Duffey Lake Road to the edge of Garibaldi Provincial Park and the popular year-round resort of Whistler.

Accommodation: Whistler for 2 nights

DAY 12 WHISTLER

Full day to relax and enjoy outdoor activities including hiking, sailing, windsurfing, golfing, tennis and boating, as well as shopping in Whistler Village.

DAY 13 WHISTLER - VANCOUVER (121 KM)

Morning at leisure to visit the village. Scenic two-hour drive to Vancouver. Evening free to do some last-minute shopping or sample the fine cuisine and nightlife of Vancouver.

Accommodation: Near Vancouver International Airport for 1 night

DAY 14 VANCOUVER - END OF TOUR

Check-in at Vancouver International Airport for your departure flight.

ITINERARY

DAY 1 ARRIVAL IN VICTORIA

A certified marine biologist provides insight into the environment and habits of orca, minke and grey whales as well as other marine wildlife. Return to your hotel afterwards for an evening at leisure.

DAY 3 VICTORIA - TOFINO (317 KM)

Be sure that you have your camera at the ready – a panorama of scenic beauty is about to unfold before you. Your road leads across Vancouver Island to the Pacific Coast winding through ancient rainforests and provincial parks. You're venturing into true wildlife territory, exemplified by The Pacific Rim National Park - a marvel of ecological and geographical diversity.

Accommodation: Tofino for 2 nights

DAY 4 TOFINO

Today you board a Zodiac boat to take a captivating bear watching excursion and speed along the lush coastline to the bears' feeding grounds. When the tide goes out the bears emerge from the forests and forage along the shores in search of rock crabs, providing the perfect opportunity to see these incredible creatures in their natural habitat. Back on dry land, you're free to explore the rugged coastline along the network of hiking trails or to walk the shoreline in search of shells and driftwood. Perhaps enrich your experience with a visit to the Himwitsa Art Gallery and marvel at the collection of authentic pieces native to the Tofino area.

DAY 5 TOFINO - SONORA RESORT (290 KM, land only)

This morning, the spectacular winding road takes you back to the eastern coast of Vancouver Island with. Your route will introduce you to many gems you may wish to stop at for a brief visit at the native rock carvings at Sproat Lake or the picturesque falls at Little Qualicum Falls Provincial Park. Today is yours to explore this vibrant cosmopolitan city. Boutique shoppes line Robson Street, offering everything from high fashion to aboriginal artwork. Perhaps pay a visit to Khot-La-Cha Art Gallery and Gift Shop, featuring masks, prints, gold and silver jewellery, wood carvings, textiles and clothing produced by First Nation artists. Stanley Park is interwoven with paved forested trails and features an enthralling zoo at its centre and the fascinating Klahowya Village. The boardwalks along the seawall provide sweeping views of the water and the rising mountains of the mainland. Discover the charms and sights of this truly magnificent city on the water.

DAY 9 VANCOUVER - END OF TOUR

Today you check out and proceed to Vancouver International Airport in time to check-in for your departure flight.



The rest of the day is yours to create your own urban adventure amid the stores, parks, restaurants, theatres and other attractions of downtown Vancouver.

Accommodation: Vancouver for 2 nights

DAY 2 VANCOUVER

Today take some time to independently explore this vibrant city, offering many attractions such as Canada Place, the dynamic Robson Street, Chinatown and historic Gastown. Perhaps visit Stanley Park en route to Cleveland Dam and the Capilano Suspension Bridge in the North Shore rainforest. Here you can cross the 137m-long bridge over a spectacular canyon to the Treetops Adventure observation structure for even more incredible views of this old growth forest.

DAY 3 VANCOUVER - WHISTLER (125 KM)

Today you depart on your journey to Whistler - the home of the 2010 Winter Olympics and one of the premier outdoor recreation villages in North America. You will travel along the scenic Sea-to-Sky Highway, traversing five distinct climatic zones from rainforest to semi-arid alpine forest. The road also crosses the historic Pemberton Trail and Gold Rush Trail, used by prospectors in the 18th century. Travelling through small towns such as Squamish and skirting the shores of Daisy Lake, you arrive in picturesque Whistler Village set at the base of Whistler and Blackcomb mountains.

Accommodation: Whistler for 2 nights

DAY 4 WHISTLER

The many charms of Whistler are yours to discover today. The 2010 Winter Olympics showcased the multitude of sights and activities available in Whistler, many of them operating year round. The local cafes and restaurants of the village provide the perfect destination for visitors leisurely exploring the pedestrian walkways and town squares. DAY 9 VICTORIA

Today, explore this elegant capital city. We suggest a visit to Beacon Hill Park and the Art Gallery of Greater Victoria. You may decide to drop in for afternoon tea at the Fairmont Empress Hotel and experience a taste of British charm. No stay in the city is complete without a tour of the world-famous Butchart Gardens – a brilliant collection of thousands of plants, exploding in lush colours and textures.

DAY 10 VICTORIA - SALT SPRING ISLAND (52KM – LAND ONLY)

The road winds back through the passes and valleys of the Rocky Mountains and their characteristic communities before descending down to the sparkling lights of Vancouver. ITINERARY

DAY 1 ARRIVAL IN VANCOUVER

Arrive Vancouver International Airport, transfer independently to your downtown hotel. The Roadbook you received will have all the information needed for your holiday/trip/journey. The rest of the day is yours to create your own urban adventure amid the stores, parks, restaurants, theatres and other attractions of downtown Vancouver.

Accommodation: Vancouver for 2 nights

DAY 2 VANCOUVER

Today you embark on a city tour of Vancouver. This guided coach features such attractions as Canada Place, the dynamic Robson Street, Chinatown and historic Gastown. The tour makes stops in Stanley Park en route to Cleveland Dam and the Capilano Suspension Bridge in the North Shore rainforest. Cross the 137m-long bridge over a spectacular canyon to the Treetops Adventure observation structure for even more incredible views of this old growth forest. Return to downtown Vancouver and perhaps enjoy a delicious meal at one of the many dining venues featuring cuisine from around the world.

DAY 3 VANCOUVER - WHISTLER (125 KM)

Today you depart on your journey to Whistler - the home of the 2010 Winter Olympics and one of the premier outdoor recreation villages in North America. You will travel along the scenic Sea-to-Sky Highway, traversing five distinct climatic zones from rainforest to semi-arid alpine forest. The road also crosses the historic Pemberton Trail and Gold Rush Trail, used by prospectors in the 18th century. Travelling through small towns such as Squamish and skirting the shores of Daisy Lake, you arrive in picturesque Whistler Village set at the base of Whistler and Blackcomb mountains.

Accommodation: Whistler for 2 nights

DAY 4 WHISTLER

The many charms of Whistler are yours to discover today. The 2010 Winter Olympics showcased the multitude of sights and activities available in Whistler, many of them operating year round. The many cafes and restaurants of the village provide the perfect destination for visitors leisurely exploring the pedestrian walkways and town squares. Woodland trails surround the village, as does a well developed network of biking and hiking trails for outdoor enthusiasts of all ability.

DAY 5 *Lodges and Ranches category*: WHISTLER - ASHCROFT (227 KM)

Today you head east into the British Columbia interior, passing through the high elevations home to small towns such as Lillooet. This quiet community is quickly becoming a destination for outdoor enthusiasts and specialty agriculture such as Merlot and Riesling grapes that flourish in the dry, warmer summers. Journeying into the ranch lands, you arrive at the ranch for a 2-night stay. You will spend the night at Sundance Guest Ranch in Ashcroft with a herd of 100 horses where you explore the surrounding countryside on a guided trail ride led by an experienced wrangler. (D)

Accommodation: Sundance Guest Ranch for 2 nights

OR

DAY 5 WHISTLER - SUN PEAKS (356 KM) *Standard category:*

Today you weave your way through the mountains of British Columbia and pass by the long shores of Lillooet Lake and the community that has grown up around it. Passing between the towering rock walls of the Fraser Canyon, you'll be amazed at the white water rapids of the Fraser River gushing far below over 750,000 litres of water surge through the 34-metre Hell's Gate gorge every minute. Following the winding waters of the South Thompson River area, you'll enter a land home to vast herds of cattle and cowboys on horseback. Continuing on to Kamloops and then Sun Peaks, you will have seen a cross-section of the many environments and landscapes of the Rockies.

Accommodation: Sun Peaks for 2 nights

DAY 6 *Lodges and Ranches category:* ASHCROFT

Today you enjoy a full day on the ranch. Start out with a walk around the trails that lead out from the property, or take in a game of horseshoes with friends and other guests. You may also choose to participate in a morning or afternoon guided horseback riding trail excursion. Immerse yourself in this glorious 'western' way of life! (B, L, D)

OR

DAY 6 *Standard category:* SUN PEAKS

Today you'll discover the year-round mountain community of Sun Peaks. Encircled by three mountains, this authentic Canadian destination features over 40 locally-owned restaurants, shops and accommodations. Just steps from your hotel you can join a local guide for a cross-country bike tour or head up the Sunburst Chairlift (mid-June - early Sept) to hike through the lush alpine wildflowers. Perhaps finish off the day with a round of golf at British Columbia's highest golf course or a serene paddle on a nearby lake in a rented canoe or kayak.

DAY 7 *Lodges and Ranches category:* ASHCROFT - CLEARWATER / WELLS GRAY PROVINCIAL PARK (220 KM)

Today you depart your ranch and after passing through the surrounding rural woodlands, you begin your journey along the Yellowhead Highway. This route spans 4 provinces from Saskatchewan to British Columbia and ranges thousands of feet in elevation. You follow the Thompson River as your journey takes you through windswept cowboy country and into the gorges of the North Thompson River before opening up into Clearwater Lake. The mountains part to reveal the aquamarine, glacier-fed lakes perched above the emerald valleys and grazing elk of Jasper National Park, one of Canada's premiere wildlife and environmental refuges.

Accommodation: Jasper for 1 night

DAY 9 JASPER - BANFF (380 KM)

Today you have the rare experience of driving through two of Canada's first and most prestigious national parks. Departing Jasper, the highway will take you past beautiful Lake Louise, reflecting the Columbia Glacier in the distance between mountain peaks. Arriving in Banff, you will instantly be charmed by this perfect mountain village with its quaint restaurants, boutique retailers and lush forest surroundings. The Elk population nearly surpasses the human as they casually meander up and down the town streets.

Accommodation: Banff for 2 nights

DAY 10 BANFF NATIONAL PARK

The entire day is free to tour Banff and the surrounding area. We suggest a visit to the Luxton Museum, a gondola ride to the top of Sulphur Mountain or a stroll through town admiring the many shops. You may try river rafting on the Bow River or take a boat tour on Lake Minnewanka.

DAY 11 BANFF - WATERTON LAKES NATIONAL PARK (361 KM)

Leaving behind the quiet forests of Banff, you drive southwest today on your journey to the southern reaches of Alberta. After passing through the urban hub of Calgary, today's route takes you near the historic Fort Macleod, one of the first operational posts of the famous Royal Canadian Mounted Police. Formed as a frontier law force that ranged over the western provinces, the RCMP grew to become Canada's national police force in service today. Approaching the United States border, the protected, pristine beauty of Waterton Lakes National Park dominates the horizon with its stark and captivating beauty.

Accommodation: Near Waterton Lakes National Park for 2 nights

DAY 12 WATERTON LAKES NATIONAL PARK (138 KM)

The beauty of this UNESCO World Heritage Site is yours to further explore today. A relatively unknown park in the national park system, this area of plateaus, forests, prime fishing rivers and hectares of mountain wildflowers is truly the hidden gem of Alberta. Many marked scenic drives such as the Akamina Parkway and Chief Mountain Highway allow visitors to see the interior of the park with its shallow, clear alpine lakes and old growth forests without long overland hikes.

DAY 13 WATERTON LAKES NATIONAL PARK - ROSSLAND/CASTLEGAR (494 KM)

Driving west today, you drive through the British Columbia interior and the mountain village of Fernie, known to skiers all over the world for its superb alpine skiing with some of the heaviest snowfalls and most dependable powder conditions. You cross the provincial boundary back into British Columbia to and pass through Cranbrook, a small community that grew up around the development of the Crowsnest Railway line at the end of the 19th century. Keeping just north of the United States border, you travel farther west across the rugged interior of the Rocky Mountains. Later you arrive in Rossland, home to many outdoor activities such as horseback riding, championship golf courses, mountain biking tours as well as various outdoor dining patios around town with spectacular views.

Accommodation: Rossland for 1 night

DAY 14 ROSSLAND/CASTLEGAR - OSOYOOS (221 KM)

Today you depart Rossland and embark on the Crowsnest Highway as it cuts through the heights of the Monashee Mountains. One of the most dramatic intersections is the Bonanza Pass, offering a splendid photo opportunity as you leave the Kootenays for the Western Boundary regions. Driving into the Osoyoos region, you may glimpse the developing vineyards as they flourish in the warming, temperate climate. In partnership with the NK'MIP First Nations people native to the region, the Spirit Ridge Vineyard has blossomed into a world class winery, offering fine dining and tastings.

Accommodation: Osoyoos for 2 nights

DAY 15 OSOYOOS

Today is at leisure to further explore the quiet town of Osoyoos. We suggest spending part of the day walking along the 19kms of sandy beaches of Osoyoos Lake. You may also wish to visit the unique Haynes Point Provincial Park where the park access road takes you out on a narrow spit in the middle of the lake. Spend the afternoon at one of the pubs or wine bistros that line the shoreline near the middle of town.

DAY 16 OSOYOOS - VANCOUVER (398 KM)

Today you head westward for the coast on your return trip to Vancouver. Travelling along the northern edge of North Cascades National Park, the terrain quickly becomes more mountainous as you pass through small towns such as Merritt, Hope and Chilliwack. Descend down from the mountains to the shining spires and elegant bridges of Vancouver. If time permits, enjoy a late afternoon visit to some of the high-fashion boutiques of the downtown core, or relax at your hotel before perhaps indulging in an evening of fine dining at one of the dozens of restaurants of the downtown area.

Accommodation: Vancouver for 1 night

DAY 17 - VANCOUVER / END OF TOUR

Today your tour comes to an end as you check out of your hotel and proceed to Vancouver International Airport for your return flight.

Accommodation: Port Hardy for 1 night

DAY 10 PORT HARDY - CAMPBELL RIVER (233 KM)

Today you travel south along the eastern shore of Vancouver Island. After following the shores of Nimpkish Lake the road turns inland, giving you a roadside view of the rugged landscape of the island's interior. You arrive at Campbell River, known as a centre for some of the world's best sport fishing.

DAY 6 JASPER - WELLS GRAY PROVINCIAL PARK / CLEARWATER (318 KM)

Drive the scenic Yellowhead Highway to Wells Gray Park. Before leaving the Rocky Mountains you will encounter one of its most spectacular sights, the mist-shrouded peak of Mount Robson. The highest peak in the Rockies can be seen for miles as you wind your way south through a vast unspoiled landscape. A visit to the volcano shaped wilderness of Wells Gray Provincial Park is worth the detour. Explore the park's mineral springs, serene lakes, dormant volcanoes and rushing falls. Not to be missed are the towering Helmcken Falls near the entrance to the park. Overnight in Clearwater.

Accommodation: Clearwater for 1 night

DAY 7 WELLS GRAY PROVINCIAL PARK / CLEARWATER - TYAX LODGE & HELISKIING OR SPRUCE HILL RESORT & SPA (397 KM)

This morning perhaps visit the Yellowhead Museum for a taste of frontier life or Spahats Creek Park before travelling through the 'Lakes Country' region. DAY 9 TYAX LODGE & HELISKIING OR SPRUCE HILL RESORT & SPA - WHISTLER (182 KM)

Start early today to allow yourself as much time as possible in the premier resort town of Whistler. The winding road leads through an arid landscape that gradually changes to lush forests lined with snow-capped mountain ranges. Accommodation: Calgary for 1 night

DAY 2 CALGARY - DRUMHELLER (135 KM)

Leaving the city and heading east, you pass through the outer reaches of Calgary's expansive communities and pass into the Badlands – an arid, rocky region displaying the geological and paleontological history of the last 200 million years. This area is one of the largest, accessible dinosaur fields in the world, producing thousands of fossils with new discoveries every year. You may like to independently visit the Royal Tyrrell Museum that tells the story of the ancient animals that roamed the land. Overnight in Drumheller.

Accommodation: Drumheller for 1 night

DAY 3 DRUMHELLER - KYLE / LA REATA RANCH (393 KM)

Today we journey across Alberta over the provincial border into Saskatchewan – the Bread Basket of Canada. Although famous for its nearendless wheat fields, the province is home to a diverse environment of rolling plains, northern forests and waterways. Arriving at La Reata Ranch, the next two days are yours to explore this beautiful landscape on horseback during the day, and spend the evenings living the social life of a Canadian cowboy. Overnight at La Reata Ranch. All meals included. (B/L/D)

Accommodation: Kyle for 2 nights

DAY 4 LA REATA RANCH

A second day to spend on horseback with your knowledgeable guides as they reveal the natural wonders, the history of the land and the stories of its ancient and modern peoples. The ranch offers guests the opportunity to see how cowboys lived and worked the ranches, and how a modern ranch has adapted to today's reality. Overnight at La Reata Ranch. All meals included. DAY 5 KYLE / LA REATA RANCH - REGINA (311 KM)

DAY 6 REGINA TO SASKATOON (263 KM)

Driving northward, the road leads to Saskatoon – once a meeting place and formative centre for popular rock and folk music in the late 1960s and early 1970s. Take the remainder of the day and explore this quintessential Canadian town. Overnight in Saskatoon.

Accommodation: Saskatoon for 2 nights

DAY 7 SASKATOON / WASNUSKEWIN HERITAGE PARK

DAY 9 LLOYDMINSTER - EDMONTON (250 KM)

After a short 2.5-hour drive, you arrive at the seat of Alberta's provincial government, Edmonton. Although it is the administrative head of the province and boasts the grand public buildings and monuments that commemorate its title, the city is also home to large urban parks, bike paths and pedestrian walkways that let you discover fascinating sights and unique neighbourhoods. Overnight in Edmonton.

Accommodation: Edmonton for 1 night

DAY 10 EDMONTON - JASPER (365 KM)

The grandeur of the Rocky Mountains awaits! As you drive west into the foothills, the mountains grow in the distance until they are suddenly looming outside every window on today's scenic drive. Winding your way through the passes and valleys, you arrive in the outdoor-adventure hub of Jasper. This quiet alpine town is home to magnificent lodges and the jumping off point for excursions, tours and other exciting attractions in Jasper National Park. Overnight in Jasper.

Accommodation: Jasper for 2 nights

DAY 11 JASPER

DAY 1 ARRIVAL IN WHITEHORSE, YUKON

Arrive at Whitehorse Airport and transfer independently to your hotel in central Whitehorse. The Jonview Roadbook you received will have all the information needed for your holiday/trip/journey. The remainder of the day is yours to explore this historic town. Overnight in Whitehorse.

Accommodation: Whitehorse for 1 night

DAY 2 WHITEHORSE TO HAINE'S JUNCTION (154 KM)

Begin your northern adventure as you head west through the small villages of the territory to Haine's Junction, situated on the edge of the massive Kluane National Park. Overnight in Haine's Junction.

Accommodation: Haine's Junction for 2 nights

DAY 3 HAINE'S JUNCTION

A day free at leisure is a good opportunity to explore the village. Perhaps pay a visit to the Champagne and Aishihik First Nations' Da Kų Cultural Centre, an interactive living museum that celebrates the history, culture, and art of the Indigenous people of the area. Afterwards, perhaps drop by the St. Elias Convention Centre to see the permanent and rotating collection of art, reflecting the modern interpretations of local and recent artists. Overnight in Haines Junction.

DAY 4 HAINE'S JUNCTION TO BEAVER CREEK (291 KM)

Today you continue west, stopping just short of the international border. Hiking trails of various skill levels are all close by and easily accessible along the Alaska Highway. After checking into your hotel, depart on an incredible flightseeing tour to see the incredible sights of Kluane National Park from spectacular heights. The St. Elias mountains rise up from the sweeping lines of the glacier fields, the highest being Mt. Logan at almost 6000 metres making it the second-highest point in North America. After a day of exploration, spend some time at the hotel's large fire pit for some camaraderie with your fellow guests under the gleaming Yukon stars. Overnight in Beaver Creek.

Accommodation: Beaver Creek for 1 night

DAY 5 BEAVER CREEK TO FAIRBANKS (501 KM)

Crossing into the United States, you travel the Alaska Highway en route to Fairbanks, travelling through a chain of small towns that have played parts in the stories and history of Alaska such as Tok, Delta Junction and Eielson. This intriguing community is administrative hub of Alaska's interior, located less than 200 km south of the Arctic Circle. Overnight in Fairbanks

Accommodation: Fairbanks for 1 night

DAY 6 FAIRBANKS TO DENALI NATIONAL PARK (265 KM)

Today's route takes you along the George Parks Highway, across the Tanana River and on to Denali National Park. The towering mountains, wide valleys, roaring rivers and rippling streams of Alaska's interior offer visitors excellent opportunities for outdoor activities. You may decide to independently arrange hiking, fishing, or canoeing against the backdrop of a pristine wilderness. Driving south, you will soon see Mount McKinley, North America's tallest peak at 6193 m – an eternal sentinel that marks the entrance into Denali National Park. Overnight in Denali National Park.

Accommodation: Denali National Park for 2 nights

DAY 7 DENALI NATIONAL PARK

Today you may decide to independently explore some of the many day hike trails in Denali National Park. The protected parklands stretch out serenely beneath the shadows of the majestic Mount McKinley, giving visitors the opportunity to see moose, caribou, grizzly bears, and Dall sheep. Many of the animals can often be spotted in plain view from the access roads. Overnight in Denali National Park.

DAY 8 DENALI NATIONAL PARK TO ANCHORAGE (380 KM)

Today you will continue your adventure southbound, traversing vast woodlands of spruce, birch, and aspen. Descending from the interior, Alaska's great geographical diversity becomes evident as the dense evergreen forests and windswept mountains give way to the lush Matanuska River Valley. The Matanuska River Valley is the richest agricultural region in Alaska, where 20-hour summer days produce giant vegetables. Before dusk, you will reach Alaska's largest city, Anchorage, located at the head of Cook Inlet. Overnight in Anchorage.

Accommodation: Anchorage for 2 nights

DAY 9 ANCHORAGE

Today is yours to experience the modern city of Anchorage and its surroundings. Explore Chugach National Forest, a wildlife photographer's delight that is also popular with anglers and hikers. You may decide to have a relaxing day in town, visiting the Anchorage Tourism Centre, or perhaps a leisurely stroll through the beautiful displays of the Anchorage Botanical Gardens featuring more than 1100 species of hardy perennials and over 150 native arctic plant species. End the day on a waterside patio and perhaps a dinner of famous Alaskan crab! Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 10 ANCHORAGE TO TOK (512 KM)

Today depart Anchorage and travel east along the highways just above the fjords and inlets that help create some of the most dramatic park settings in the north. Perhaps pack a picnic lunch before leaving Anchorage and stop at milepost marker 101 and the large Matanuska Glacier State Recreation Area. This is a popular location to stop and take advantage of the easy walking trail that parallels the glacier and the Matanuska River. A pavilion provides shelter and a resting spot for those who wish to simply sit and enjoy the view. Continue on to Tok where the remainder of the day is at leisure. Overnight in Tok.

Accommodation: Tok for 1 night

DAY 11 TOK TO DAWSON CITY (298 KM)

For a true sense of the wilds of the north, today's route will bring out the adventurer in you. Striking back towards the border through some of the most untouched wilderness in North America, you pass back over into Canada at Little Gold Camp – the highest border crossing between the two countries. Following the aptly-named Top-of-the-World Highway the road continues on to riverside town of Dawson City, one of the major focal points of the 18th century Gold Rush where prospectors made and lost their fortunes. Overnight in Dawson Creek.

Accommodation: Dawson City for 2 nights

DAY 12 DAWSON CITY

Relive the days of prospecting with a day of independent exploration of this historic city. Many original buildings have stood the test of time, while others have been faithfully restored to either their original grandeur, or rustic ruggedness. Take the day to tour the historic landmarks of Dawson City and visit the surrounding goldfields that still resonate with the Klondike’s “Spirit of ’98”. You may choose to try your hand at panning for gold at an authentic, working gold claim. For a slightly different venue, visit Diamond Tooth Gertie’s Gambling Hall and try your luck at any of the establishment’s games of chance. Overnight in Dawson City.

DAY 13 DAWSON CITY TO WHITEHORSE (532 KM)

The Klondike Highway is your access route back to the southern region of the Yukon. Along the way, you will catch glimpses of the mighty Stewart River before it joins with the mighty Yukon River for its 3,500 km journey up to Alaska’s Bering Sea. You will be passing through the traditional hunting grounds of the Kaska Indians, where bears, wolves, lynx, and moose roam in abundance. You may choose to stop at one of the gold rush staging posts and Bonanza Creek to see the origins of the Gold Rush and the way of life those early prospectors experienced. Arriving in Whitehorse, relax after a long day of travelling at your hotel or perhaps visit one of the many eateries around town. Overnight in Whitehorse.

Accommodation: Whitehorse for 2 nights

DAY 14 WHITEHORSE

Today you embark on a full-day scenic trip along the South Klondike Highway to Fraser, British Columbia. Upon arrival, you board the world-famous narrow gauge White Pass & Yukon Route Railway to journey through areas that still echo with the hardships and fortunes of the past such as Glacier Gorge, Dead Horse Gulch and Bridal Veil Falls. The route travels over the White Pass Summit, offering views from a height of 880m before ending in Skagway, Alaska. Return by motorcoach to Whitehorse to relax for the evening at your hotel. Overnight in Whitehorse

DAY 15 END OF TOUR

Today your northern adventure comes to an end as you transfer independently to the airport for your departing flight

As you travel through Jasper and the surrounding area in a comfortable, sightseeing sidecar will you be amazed at some of the beautiful scenery as you learn about the ways the local contribute to the rich diversity of the park. The guides are trained to seek out all of the park's most iconic creatures, providing a great opportunity to view the animals in their natural habitat. Have your camera ready to capture some amazing photos of the highlights of this informative and entertaining "Discovery Tour".

This wildlife viewing tour is a driving tour with minimal walking. The maximum group size is 28 passengers. Photos of wildlife are usually taken from the inside the vehicle or on the ground at a safe distance from the animals. While the natural habitat around Jasper is conducive to animal sightings, animal viewing is not guaranteed and depends largely on the season, the time of day, and the weather. The selected route is at the discretion of the driver guide.

River Raft Float Trip on Athabasca River (2.5 hour)

This fun and easy rafting / scenic float trip travels down the Athabasca River, a designated Canadian Heritage River. A Jasper National Park licensed guide will provide commentary on the human and natural history of Jasper while navigating along the same route used by the fur traders over 2 centuries ago. Lifejackets and the specially designed, 7 m / 25 ft long, oar-powered rafts offer a safe and comfortable ride through several small, easy sets of rapids and calm stretches that any first-time rafter will enjoy. The guides do all the rowing while the group sits back and enjoys the ride and spectacular scenery. There is a chance of seeing various wildlife including elk, deer, moose, coyotes, wolves, eagles, ospreys, mountain sheep and bears. This trip is designed for the whole family; toddlers to seniors - ages 2-99 are welcome.

Spirit Island Cruise on Maligne Lake (2.5 hour)

Let Maligne Tours take you on a 90-minute cruise on one of the Rockies' most picturesque lakes. The tour is operated in a glass-enclosed, heated cruise boat and is fully narrated by a Transport Canada licensed crew. Mid-way through there is a photo stop at Spirit Island where passengers disembark for a short walk to the lookout point. This is a wonderful photo opportunity not to be missed!
